I am writing about your recent application for unemployment insurance benefits. We regret that you do not qualify for benefits as your Record(s) of Employment show(s) that you do not have enough weeks of insurable employment. The specific reason is checked below.

- ☐ You have only _____ weeks of insurable employment in your qualifying period. A minimum of _____ weeks of insurable employment is now required to qualify for benefits. You should apply again when you have at least this number of weeks in your qualifying period.

To qualify for benefits, the minimum number of weeks of insurable employment varies from 10 to 14 depending on the unemployment rate in your area of residence.

- ☐ You have only _____ weeks of insurable employment in your qualifying period*. But at least _____ weeks of insurable employment are now needed to qualify for benefits. This minimum number is based on the rate of unemployment where you maintain your ordinary place of residence. If the number of weeks changes in your favour, we will let you know.

- ☒ You have only fifteen weeks of insurable employment in your qualifying period*. But at least 20 weeks of insurable employment are needed to qualify for benefits. This minimum number is needed because you are considered as a new entrant or re-entrant to the labour force. This is because you were not in the labour force (nor getting UI benefits) for at least 14 weeks in the 52-week period before your qualifying period*.

- ☐ You have only _____ weeks of insurable employment in your qualifying period*. But at least _____ weeks of insurable employment are now needed to qualify for benefits. This minimum number is based on the rate of unemployment in the region where you maintain your ordinary place of residence and on the number of weeks counted as weeks of benefits paid to you in your qualifying period*. If the number of weeks related to the rate of unemployment changes in your favour, we will let you know.

*The qualifying period is either the 52 weeks before the effective date of your present claim or since the start of your last claim, whichever is shorter. If your qualifying period has a 52-week duration it may be possible to extend it if during this period you were not employed in insurable employment nor receiving UI benefits because you were:

- a) incapable of work by reason of sickness, injury, quarantine or pregnancy;
- b) receiving total temporary workmen's compensation payments for all illness or injury;
- c) in attendance at a course of instruction or other program to which you were referred by the Commission;
- d) confined in a jail, penitentiary or other similar institution.

If one of these situations applies to you, contact this office with the details as soon as possible.

We are returning the Record(s) of Employment you sent us with your claim. If you worked for any additional weeks in your qualifying period, you should get the Record(s) of Employment from your employer(s) and send them to us along with the one(s) we returned with this letter. If you have not been given a Record of Employment from a former employer, and if you have difficulty getting it, we will be glad to help you. Send us the name and address of the employer and any proof of your employment like pay slips or cheque stubs.

You have a right to appeal this decision to a board of referees. If you wish to appeal, please read the enclosed brochure. It explains the procedure.
